Cherokee Trace Drive-Thru Safari Park has added 3 new animal exhibits to their collection. The Pere David Deer, the Tibetan Yak and the Wildebeest. One of the newest animals to come to this East Texas park is the VERY rare Pere David Deer. Originally from China it was extinct in its native land until recently when captive raised deer were reintroduced. The Tibetan Yak, from the highlands of Tibet are a unique sight in Texas and are sure to be worth the trip. The third animal to the collection is the Gnu pronounced "NEW" or Wildebeest. This fast running African native is a great addition and will add to the feel that you are TRULY on the African Savanna.

On this 300-acre wildlife park visitors may feed and take photographs of hundreds of exotic and endangered animals from around the world thriving in an open range habitat.
